Minutes for the Nineteenth Meeting of the Baltimore Area Wood Turners (BAT)

I was born in 1947 and have resided primarily in rural Pennsylvania among the hardwood forests of the Northeast. I have worked with wood most of my life but have focused on woodturning since 1994.

I find great appeal in the regimentation and geometrical patterns afforded by segmented construction. I use simple clean shapes in much of my work so as not to detract from these patterns. I am particularly fond of the interplay of light and shadows when viewing my open segmented work under single source lighting. In the last several years I have developed a heightened sense of the natural world around me. Much of my latest work reflects this by the use of organic forms, texturing and non-symmetrical shapes. Most of my art is not intended to make statements about myself or my world. I focus upon creating objects that are satisfying to hold, view and feel. If you enjoy experiencing my work then I have succeeded.

I teach workshops on segmented turnings and have conducted demonstrations at the local level, regional level and at the national convention of the American Association of Woodturners. I authored the book *Segmented Wood Turning* in order to share my process with other wood artists.
